

Sacred Heart Primary School Curriculum Theme Plan

Year 5 Watercolour Painting



Term 3

Rationale: In this unit pupils should be taught to develop their techniques, including their control and their use of materials, with creativity, experimentation and an increasing awareness of different kinds of art, craft and design.

Pupils will be taught:

- * to create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas
- * to improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing & painting with a range of materials

This unit builds upon painting and techniques already taught as set out in Sacred Hearts' progression of skills document.

Attention Grabber: A visit from a local artist!

- Learning Objectives:
- To have some knowledge and understanding of historical development in the wider world:

- To help children understand society and their place within it, so that they develop a sense of their cultural heritage;
- To develop in children the skills of enquiry, investigation, analysis, evaluation and presentation.
- Identify and define the important people, places, and events of local history.
- Make connections between local history and major national and international events
- To understand how events in the past have influenced Henley today

More Able Children will: Mix and match colours to create atmosphere and light effects. Mix colour, shades and tones with confidence building on previous knowledge.
